### This same day in 1957

Extract from IDLE CHATTER Vol 2 No 7

THURS. AUG 16<sup>TH</sup> 1957

*IN MEMORIAN. The Quandialla Co-operative Society Ltd passed away quietly on Wednesday June 12<sup>th</sup> at 11.45am after a long and painful illness. Born on the 20<sup>th</sup> of April 1932 as The Quandialla Agricultural Bureau Co-operative store, it survived as this until the disastrous fire of January 20<sup>th</sup> 1951. It then took onto itself the name of the Quandialla Co-operative Society Ltd., and from that date the purchasing power of its working capital has diminished slowly and surely until its demise. One hesitates to define the cause of its death and no post mortem would be of any assistance. Its passing is mourned by the other business people in the town and by all those who take pride in their district. Meanwhile there are rumours too silly to repeat. So and so is going to buy it for so and so. So and so are coming from so and so and open it as a branch, and so the tongues wag merrily while Hungerford and Spooner’s man, Mr Wiggin, sits sphinx like and wonders. I am going to say this even though I may hang for it. Never have I seen a body of shareholders give up 2978 pounds and 13 shillings with less fight. And now let it rest in peace until we see what happens to it.*

*BOWLS. Sixteen Quandialla players paid a visit to Parkes on Sunday and though news seeps through very slowly, I can safely say that a good time was had by all. Ned Sommerville, Fred Armour, Arthur Penfold and skipper Reg Penfold brought home a trophy, and perhaps it would be a blessing if the facts as to how they won it, were not published.
