In 2012 Fanny and The Thrillseekers travelled through the Riverina on a Flood Raiser Country Hall Tour where they raised funds for an organisation called 'Blazaid' that helps communities recover after a natural disaster.

Fanny and the boys have taken the stage at the Sydney Festival, VIVID Festival, Man from Snowy River Bush Festival, Peats Ridge, Darwin Festival and more, including a very successful 2015 Tamworth Country Music Festival.

In September Fanny released her debut album called "Small Town Big Shot", a celebration of family and life in regional Australia. This album is produced by highly acclaimed Matt Fell and crowd-funded through 'Pozible'.

Now on September 25<sup>th</sup>, Fanny and The Thrillseekers will be starting another Country Halls – Small Town Big Shot Tour with Quandialla being lucky enough to be included in their selection of venues.

Fanny and her band just don't come to country halls to make money for themselves. When Fanny visits a town everyone wins, our Hall will receive payment for the hire of the hall.
