MOTOR NEURONE DISEASE - FUNDRAISER

Motor neurone disease (MND) is a progressive disease involving degeneration of the motor neurones and wasting of the muscles. Motor function is controlled by the upper motor neurones in the brain that descend to the spinal cord; these neurones activate lower motor neurones. The lower motor neurones exit the spinal cord and directly activate muscles. With no nerves to activate them, muscles gradually weaken and waste. MND can affect a person's ability to walk, speak, swallow and breathe.

The Quandialla Boys fared better, winning the softball by beating Tullibigeal 16-11. The girl's "A" basketball was also won by Tullibigeal 28-4. The Quandi team comprised Mary Walsh, Laurel Causer, Marilyn Hunter, Carol Sinclair, Denise Napier, Glenda Aylen and Lorraine Luck. For Quandialla Laurel Causer and Lorraine Luck both scored 2 goals.
