QUANDIALLA WEATHER

I have just finished my end of month paperwork for the Bureau of Meteorology and it made me think about the early weather readings of the village. The weather has been recorded in Quandialla since 1925, I'm not sure about the early years (will stick my neck out) and assume the owner of the Post Office had this job then as they have had in the past. I do not know the earlier methods of recording – can anyone help me out?

When my folks arrived in Quandi in 1969 and took over the Post Office all weather information was recorded twice a day and entered into a book which was sent off each month. I also have memories of ringing through to the Bureau, some days you could make up to half a dozen calls before you got through and other days you could fluke it straight away, each call could take up to 5-15 minutes to relay your readings depending on how busy the bureau was at the time. I helped record the weather until the family sold the Post Office in 1973.

As the years went by the bureau moved with the times and upgraded their methods of data received. When John and I took over at the P.O. in 1995 there was a little black box that sent the rainfall through and then in 1998 we were given a bureau computer to enter all Quandialla readings. Over the years we have had 2 computer upgrades with new and

improved software. Unfortunately, last September through cost cutting, we lost the 3pm reading (no more Quandi on the 7 o'clock news!!) so we only read the weather at 9 am now.

The following information is from Data compiled by the Bureau – Climatological Extremes for Quandialla Post Office from 87 years of recording. I hope you find it interesting. (N.B: * my symbol for degrees)

1925 - 2012

Highest recorded temperature – 45* on 23.1.2001

Lowest Daily Maximum - 5* on 3.7.1984

Greatest number of days over 35* (in any one month) -

23 days in January 1981

Lowest recorded temperature – minus 6* on 30.6.1976

Highest Daily Minimum – 33* on 3.1.1973

Greatest number of days below 2.2* (in any one month) –

22 days in July 1976

Three Wettest Years – 1956 – 972.3mm

1950 - 956.9mm

2010 - 874.9mm

Highest Daily Rainfall – 112.3mm on 19.1.1962

Highest Monthly Rainfall - 297.2mm in January 1984

Highest number of rain days in any one month -

22 days in August 1990

Three Driest Years - 2006 - 187.4mm

1982 - 207.7mm

1944 – 212.8mm
